#### Saskatchewan's Legislative Building

The Legislative Building in Regina, the provincial capital, is a must-see for political, architecture and history enthusiasts! The Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly holds sessions there, and MLAs debate matters of public interest and perform their various roles. Free guided tours are available in both official languages.





#### **Government House**

Government House was built in 1891 and served as the residence of the Provincial Lieutenant Governor until 1945. Explore the hidden treasures and discover the past along with the province's heritage at the J.E.N. Wiebe Interpretive Centre. Take in the sporadic exhibits, and tour the one hundred-year-old gardens that will certainly take you back in time.



### Prince Albert National Park

The Plains Bison is the largest land mammal in North America. For centuries, they rumbled across the Prairies herds so massive that the ground underneath would shake. Today, curious onlookers have an opportunity to observe them at the national park. Camping, hiking trails and other activities are also available!



## Batoche National Historic Site

This National Historic Site commemorates a key event in the history of the Métis in 1885, when the confrontation between the provisional Métis government and the armed forces of the Canadian government took place. Discoveries abound at the visitors' centre, which contains thousands of artefacts and information found on site by archeologists.
